





In these challenging times of escalating living costs across the UK in 2023, Nugent's services within our local communities have never been more important. Our commitment to leaving no one behind drives us to stand alongside families and individuals facing hardships, ensuring they receive the support they deserve.

As we continue our work to tackle all forms of poverty and strengthen our communities, we are asking for our supporters who are part of a school, parish, business or community group,



to help by becoming a donation drop point and collecting donations on behalf of Nugent for our three key areas;

Hygiene Hub: Our Hygiene Hub is located within our weekly Pantry, which is open every Tuesday in St Anne's Church on Overbury Street, Liverpool. It's a place where individuals can receive the support they need and pick up items to help them when they are struggling.

Why set up a donation point for the **Hygiene Hub?**

In 2022, an estimated 3,150,000 adults (6% of the population) were affected by hygiene poverty, leading to social isolation, shame, and anxiety for many. A startling statistic from ActionAid revealed that the number of UK women and people who menstruate struggling to afford period products rose from 12% to 21% in just one year, with 13% of them missing school, university, or college. Our Hygiene Hub aims to combat this issue by providing a central location in the community where individuals can easily access hygiene products.



Food Pantry: The Pantry is open every Tuesday, 1pm to 3pm, at St Anne's Church for a weekly shop to support those who may need a helping hand. The shoppers have access to a full shop, including fresh fruit, vegetables, and cupboard favourites with a weekly cost of £3.50. The value of the shop often totals £15-20 or more. making it a cost-effective way to meet grocery needs.

Why set up a donation point for the Pantry?

Food prices in the UK have soared by a staggering 15.7% in April, putting immense strain on families and individuals struggling to afford basic groceries. Food insecurity leaves many people reliant on food banks and pantries just to make ends meet. For some children living in food poverty, a free school meal could be the only guaranteed hot meal they eat in a day. By setting up a drop point, you directly contribute to the fight against food poverty in your community.

Charity Shop: Our Nugent Allerton Road Charity Shop is open Monday to Saturday and serves as a platform for giving back to the community.

Malting The Most Of Open Evenings Our Top Tip

f you're a parent of a year 5 or 6 pupil, you may be planning to attend secondary school open day/evening.

During open days/evenings, prospective pupils and their families can visit the school to see whether the facilities on o er are suitable. You will be able to visit classrooms and talk to pupils who currently attend the school.

There may also be opportunity to listen to a talk given by the school's head teacher or relevant head of department.

As this is a very important time (and unfamiliar territory for some parents), it is crucial to know what to expect and to know how to make the most of open events.

Top Tips

some background Do research before you visit a school:

· Ofsted reports are readily available on the school's website and also on local council websites.



- Does the school stipulate academic that certain requirements are necessary for entry?
- · Does your child require Special Educational Needs (SEN) support? Each school should have a SEN officer who will arrange help for pupils who require extra support.
- · Do you live in the school's catchment area?
- · Compare the school's exam results with the national average. How do the grades add up?
- Over-subscribed schools are often extremely busy during open events.

Keep in mind that certain individuals may not be able to speak to you directly.

- Bring your child with you. It is important to ask them their thoughts and what think about school's atmosphere.
- Talk to the school's pupils. Thev are the hest ambassadors for the school and can provide you a wealth of information and authentic opinion of school life.
- Are there anv extra curricular activities on offer? It is important for a school to nurture a wide variety of student interests
- · Listen to the head teacher's speech – it will give vou a good feel for the school's approach to learning and atmosphere. If the head teacher offers to answer questions, don't hold back!

xperts share 3 tips to help ease kids' back-to-school anxiety.

The experts at Outdoor Toys have put together 3 key tips on how to help transition kids back into a comfortable school routine and ease any anxieties they may have ahead of the first day back.

1. Transition them back into a school routine.

Arguably the hardest part of the first day for children is waking up in the morning, and this can be even harder for children who are nervous to go! So, the best way to prevent being late and ease their worries is to start the transition back into going to sleep early and waking up early as soon as possible.

Each night, leading up to the first day back, put your kids to sleep earlier until they are eventually sleeping at an appropriate time, and do the same with waking up. Dressing them and eating breakfast at a similar time every morning should also make it easier for both you and them on the first morning back, and they will have a routine that is familiar to them, allowing them to expect what their first day will entail.

2. Manage social anxiety.

With 65% of children and young people experiencing social anxiety, it may not come as a surprise to find the same in your own child. Returning to school can be scary for children who haven't regularly seen their friends throughout the holidays, and experiencing that in addition to first-day jitters can be overwhelming. So, why not take one stress away from them?

At some point before the first day, arrange a playdate with your child and their friend/s from school. Something as simple as playing in the garden with friends is key for a child's physical and mental growth and development, from improving self-confidence all the way to improving their motor skills. Plus, there's the added bonus of them having fun and feeling less uneasy about meeting their friends again!

3. Listen to their worries and anxieties.

As mentioned, first-day jitters are inevitable but not always easily detected. These last few days can be used as the perfect chance to sit down with your child ask them how they're feeling. Giving them an opportunity to be heard may make them feel comfortable enough to express any of their concerns for the new school year. And, of course, it gives parents a chance to offer advice, solutions and their own first-day back-to-school experiences!

Alex Price, Product Expert at Outdoor Toys, commented:"The days leading up to the first day of school can be stressful for many parents and, sometimes, it can be easy to overlook a child's anxiety or back-to-school iitters.

However, the key thing to remember is to create a comfortable and safe space for children to feel like they can express their worries, and ultimately respond with active solutions to help ease their concerns.

Safety Tips

As wi

As with all Internet activity, talk to your child about how they use Instagram, the importance of not 'oversharing, and any issues they have faced.



It is safest to change the default privacy settings in your child's account from public to private. If your child is older and you agree for them to have a public account, you should discuss strategies for coping with negative feedback and for blocking users. You should also monitor messages they receive.



Given Instagram's reported impact on young people's mental health, keep an eye out for early warning signs of such issues with your child. Seek professional support or consult online services



such as Shout at the earliest point of concern.



Regularly spring-clean your child's Instagram account with them by removing any posts and images you agree are inappropriate and blocking any concerning contacts. If you have any concerns that somebody might be trying to groom your



child you should immediately contact CEOP.

Reasons for concern

Privacy settings

A key concern regarding children's use of Instagram is the fact that the default privacy setting for accounts is 'public'. As such, unless a child actively alters their privacy settings, all of the pictures they post to Instagram will be available to anybody. This could result in their images being seen by inappropriate individuals and might lead to receiving unwanted communication.

Follower lists

In a world where celebrity success is measured by numbers of social media followers, it is understandable that children might want to grow their own list of followers. A child's non-private account can quickly grow with followers, some of whom might not have entirely innocent motives.

Terms and conditions

Instagram's 5,000-word terms and conditions states that users agree that Instagram can use and sell their sell images for others to use (without paying or further consent). Instagram also retains the right to store, use and share the personal information and direct messages of their users.

Grooming

In 2019 the NSPCC reported that Instagram was involved in more online grooming cases than any other online platform. Where the police recorded the method of communication, Instagram was used in 32% of cases, in contrast to Facebook at 23% and Snapchat at 14%.

Mental health issues

A report by the Royal Society for Public Health found that Instagram rated as the worst social media platform when it comes to its impact on young people's mental health. Being image-centred the RSPH claimed that Instagram (along with Snapchat) appears to be driving feelings of inadequacy and anxiety in young people.

B edtime Routine Tips

1. Begin with a Bath

Snuggle up on the sofa or in bed and read some soothing stories together. The sound of your voice reading may even send them off to sleep. Alternatively, your little one might prefer you to sing calming songs or lullabies to help them drift off -just ensure you're keeping things quiet and tranguil.

5. Keep Timings Consistent

A good night-time routine shouldn't be adding to your already heavy workload as parents. For this reason, try to build it into your day -keeping timings tight and only letting the whole process last a set amount of time. It might take some time for your little one to get used to the routine but try to stick with it -consistency is often key!

Snapchat Parent / Carer Advice





What is Snapchat?

Snapchat is one of the image-based social media platforms which is incredibly popular with children. One of the key features of Snapchat is that, by default, messages sent Snapchat through disappear seconds after they are viewed by the recipient. The minimum age to use Snapchat is 13 but it is a popular and widely used platform among children younger than this.

Safety Tips



As with all Internet activity, talk to your child about how they use Snapchat, the importance of not 'oversharing, and any issues they have faced.



The default privacy setting of 'My Friends' prevents children from sharing 'snaps' with users unknown to them. However, children may change this setting and make their posts public. Ensure your child is aware of the importance of maintaining strong privacy settings and check the settings your child has selected.



In the settings options, ensure your child has Snapmap set to 'ghost mode'. This will ensure that nobody can see their current location.




Ask your child if they know how to report or block a user who sends them anything that upsets them. This can be done by going to the friends list, selecting the person creating the issue and then selecting the gear icon.



Remind your child that although Snapchat automatically deletes images once seen, somebody can copy the image and share it with others.

Reasons for concern



As messages disappear shortly after being read, Snapchat has become a popular tool for abuse such as online bullying as abusers feel they will not be held to account for messages posted once they are deleted. This is supported by the fact that if somebody takes a screenshot of a message posted on Snapchat then the person who posted it is informed that this has happened, making it more uncomfortable for people to take evidence of abuse they have suffered or witnessed.



The Snap Map allows users to see the live location of their friends on a map. Cartoon-style avatars are used to represent people in a move that was clearly designed to be popular with younger users. This feature can result in children sharing their location (including effectively their home address) with individuals.



Addiction-inducing features


Children are naturally more prone to addictive behaviour than adults. As such, the inclusion of features such as 'Snap Streaks' (where two users share pictures with each other on consecutive days) encourages addictive



behaviour. Snapchat rewards longer streaks with special emojis. This can result in children increasing their daily usage of the app.

Risk of secondary apps

Snapchat allows users to link to secondary apps that can be used inside Snapchat. A recent concerning example is YOLO which allows users to offer people the opportunity to anonymously ask them questions. Such apps have led to online bullying and hate crime.

Meet Lydia Grimshaw, an Aquarist at the Aquarium in World Museum, Liverpool. No two days are the same, but here's what a day can look like taking care of the creatures you can see when you visit (and some you can't see).

9am Morning Checks and Cleaning

Do an animal welfare check on all creatures and a water check to monitor the water quality for all tanks and each of them prefer a different climate.

Some of the tanks get dirtier than others, depending on who the residents are, so as well as daily cleans we also take turns to don a wetsuit and get in the tank to do a weekly deep clean of the glass, rockwork and gravel.

llam Feeding Time

All of our aquarium residents have different feeding schedules and we use this time to sort out their meals and snacks. This often includes portioning out dry pellet, small fish, shrimpor fresh fruit for the terrapins, or weighing things for the hermit crabs to eat...



Ipm School Session

Part of our work is delivering sessions to schools that visit and teaching pupils about life in our oceans. They get a chance to get up close with some of our rockpool residents which is always really popular.

3pm Public Tour

We've recently started some behind the scenes tours of the aquarium, where visitors can learn more about how we care for our animals and meet some of the residents we look after who aren't on display in the Aguarium.

At the moment we are rearing lots of baby moon jellyfish - who are absolutely tiny and amazing.

4pm Study Time and Admin

Another part of my job is conducting regular animal welfare assessments and contacting our vets to provide suitable medicine for our animals to help keep them healthy.


