Resulting in professional dialogue at termly progress meetings, pupil tracking and data analysis with Inclusion Manager and the Head teacher.
- * To continually reflect and evaluate how well the school ensures equality of opportunities for all its pupils across a broad and balanced curriculum to ensure total inclusion for all by improving the level of pupil voice, extending our traditional school council to include a fair and representation of all pupils in school
