#### Welcome to April's out of this world edition of In Our School

This term, our school grounds have welcomed an absolutely fabulous new addition. A one of a kind piece of art that has lit up our playground: 'ST. AUSTIN'S IS OUT OF THIS WORLD' by Liverpool born and bred artist, Paul Curtis.

Paul is a Liverpudlian artist specialising in street art and large murals. He came to public attention with his very first piece of street art, "For All Liverpool's Liver Birds" (aka The Liver Bird Wings), which became a massive hit with locals, tourists and many famous faces too.

Since 2017, Paul has created more than 250 public pieces, across the UK, with most of his work found around Merseyside and Wirral. His work is well-known and sells all over the world.

He has received many accolades including: UK record holder for largest painting ever by a single artist; in 2024, Liverpool had its first-ever indoor street art exhibition, which was held at The Royal Liver Building, "In One Place", that focused solely on Paul's work; and he was also voted Merseyside Artist of the Year 2020.

Mrs Hickey said, "Spring term did not get off to a good start! In January, after the terrible weather began to fade, we commissioned Paul to begin a masterpiece for us and we are delighted with the end result."
